Gentlemen,

In reply to your letter of yesterday's date I beg leave to give the following answers to the questions which you put to me.

1. I have known Mr. de Laszlo some 8 or 10 years.
2. I met him on several occasions in society, and I sat to him for my portrait in 1915. I had friendly and open conversations with him.
3. I cannot remember whether he told me, before the War, of his determination to settle in England and become naturalized.
4. I always heard him speak of England and of the English people in a friendly way.
5. During my sitting to him, he spoke generally of the War, and I recollect that he expressed great regret that Hungary had taken part against the Allies. He never made any attempt to elicit any information from me. He was open in his expressions of his dislike of Germany.
6. I cannot recall any words used by him to show that he was devoted to England and loyal to her cause, but he certainly said nothing in a contrary sense.
7. I always had a high opinion of his personal character and sense of honour.
