July the 4th 1917, Kraschalec I. o. M.

Dear Mr. de László!

I take the pleasure in writing again the few lines to you, and trust that this letter will reach you and all yours in the best of health. Your kind letter of the 18th June with the £2. enclosure I received safely and I hope you received my acknowledgement. I didn't hear anything yet about my transfer but would be very glad if a change would come soon. Didn't you hear about it lately?

The money you so kindly sent me for the journey expenses I put aside and I will be able to proceed to Wakefield. I will let you know at once when this takes place. What I read in the papers about us encouraged me very much, but I don't know whether we Hungarians are included in this scheme or not? I should be very pleased if I could go to a neutral country or get released here. I leave to your good judgement all this I am sure I am am safe in your hands. I thank you very much indeed again for the nice parcel sent me last month it was a great relieve to have it. As I have very little left of it may I apply to your generosity again, to send me one convenience at your convenience with similar contents if possible. Eggs are not safe so I would prefer some tea or cocoa.
