the enclosed copy of an  
order of the day issued by  
the Admiral commanding  
the famous brigade of  
Marius Fustiers that did  
out wonderful fighting all  
round Oranese from  
the year in 1475 -  
by daughter (and) Dorothee

Fiddling was with her ambulance  
Corps all through this & I  
have heard on every rise of the  
work while they died in bringing  
in wounded under heavy fire.  
At the time it was almost an  
unprecedented event for a girl to be  
"citée" in an "ordre de jour" - it  
was for this she was given the  
Croix de guerre & the Belgian order  
of Leopold. Last year King George  
gave her the "military medal" for  
"Bravery in the field" - she was the  
first British woman to receive  
this - You can understand we  
are very anxious to have a good  
lecture of her - I am at my  
(part of) Deurbish
