Dear Mr. Laszlo

I went to the Home Office the day following the visit of your brother and put the case very strongly to Mr. Biddler - in the absence of Lord Cave - that Mr. Laszlo should be allowed to take a furnished house there he could be united with his family. I also mentioned your willingness to have a representative of the Home Office - or a nominee of theirs - to live on the place in the Govt interest. He expressed himself

most sympathetic and promises to
write me in a few days -
not hearing. I called again to-day &
saw how Care himself, and reported
all I had previously said to Kilder -
He said he would consider if such
could be granted and I hope he may
see his way to grant what you all
desire. I am sure he would be doing
the first thing; but fear of public
clamours may prevent all other
consideration.
