TAKE NOTICE (A) that it is alleged against you that you have shewn yourself disaffected or disloyal to His Majesty

(1) In a letter written by you to your relatives in Hungary in or about <sup>1914</sup> November 1915 in which you stated that your Naturalization caused you a severe mental conflict.

*June 23 1915*

(2) In conversation with a sitter, Mrs. Max Muller, in the Autumn of 1915.

(3) In conversation with Mr. Henry Vincent Higgins about August 1915. *See letter of 1917*

(4) By trading with the enemy by sending money to your family in Hungary.

(5) By supplying a Fugitive Hungarian Officer with money and the address of another Hungarian who might help and failing to inform the Police <sup>until</sup> within 24 hours *after*

(6) By sending letters otherwise than through the post, namely by the Dutch Diplomatic bag and also by receiving letters in the same way

(7) By attempting in December 1914 or January 1915 to persuade one Winthrop Bowen of New York to forward letters for you to Hungary;

(B) that you have unlawfully traded with and communicated with subjects of an enemy State as appears from paragraphs (1), (4) and (6) above; and

(C) that the continuance in force of the Certificate of Naturalization granted to you on the 4th September 1914 is not conducive to the public good
