My dear Philipp, Hungary is again

I am staying here in  
Paris since today ago  
and I wished to start to  
Budapest on the 27th or  
on the 28th of October.

I just got a letter from  
my wife from Budapest  
telling me, that Mance  
came to see her at the

minutes and told you  
that my stay at Venice was not  
an agreeable one, as you got  
it there. He tells to me  
too, that you have the  
intention to come to Paris  
on the 26 or 27<sup>th</sup> of October  
to stay with the Duc de  
Guiche. I would be so  
anxious to meet and to  
see you. We got always  
news from you not only through  
your kind letters, but  
through the foreign newspapers  
and from dear Macej, who  
is such a good friend of  
mine.

He gave me as address  
of yours "Hotel de l'Europe  
Venice". I wrote there  
a long registered letter  
some two months ago. I  
d'not know if this letter  
of mine ever reached  
you. I gave to you detailed  
news from our private as  
political social and  
artistic life. We spent  
some weeks at Munich  
near Lake Starnberg  
Tutzing Castle with Nene,  
Marcell, and some week  
with my mother at Teoeco

Slovakia. I took now the second  
part of my holidays, two  
weeks and now enjoying vari-  
ous arts, museums and life  
I am staying 5. Rue Scribe  
Paris. Come bye, but please  
send your answer to the  
Hungarian Legation.

Before I left Budapest  
the only son of Prince  
Tasilo Tescsich, <sup>Count</sup> George  
Festike, came to see us  
and asked us to write  
to you about following.

in September. I spend  
my holidays with my  
poor mother in Tschel-  
Kovagnie. She is 68 years  
old and she is fighting  
the Tschels and refuses  
to leave the house where  
she was born and where  
her grand-parents are  
in the cemetery. Afterwards  
we went to Schloss  
Tutzing Stabsberger See  
to stay for two weeks

with the famous Art  
Collector Wences Harned.  
You must go there with  
Lucy. He has always  
great and is simply  
beautiful his place and  
most artistic. He would  
be very pleased to enter-  
tain you. We spent 5 days  
in Minigo too. The Glas  
palace is full with pictures  
but surely a decadency.  
We spent with my wife  
4 days at Ozor's Castle  
with Trine and Trine's

Louvain, Royal Princess  
of Belgium and widow  
after Crown-Prince Rudolf  
of Austria-Hungary. I  
We spoke much of you.  
She would be so pleased  
if you could paint me  
day his portrait. I get  
still two weeks holiday,  
so perhaps I am going  
for 10 days to Paris in  
October the 10<sup>th</sup>. Next  
year in June I wish  
to come to London.

Do come to Budapest,  
You could stay with us  
and do bring little Jimmy  
with you too. He could  
play with Charlie, who  
will be 13 in October.

My kindest regards to  
your dear wife. I am  
very often thinking of you.  
I am very fond of Marczi  
and we are glad both  
when we hear and read  
about you. Success, God  
bless you. Keep good luck for
