And so I am posting it at once. I have made a flimsy giving the names of the different portraits seen in the studio.

Mr. de Laszlo benefited greatly from his holiday, and now we have to try to keep him from overdoing things again. To-day he is at Bagshot Park, painting the portrait of the Duke of Connaught, the last surviving son of Queen Victoria. This is the second sitting and there will be another on Saturday. From what I can gather they are mutually enjoying one another's company, recalling times when Europe was different to what it is to-day.
