Miss Florence Waller, who is to address Dundee Women Citizens' Association to-night

on "The Care of the Mentally Defective in their Own Homes," has done much good work for the welfare movement, and her duties as organising secretary of the Scottish Association for Mental Welfare have made her well known among Dundee social workers.
