The Marchioness of Londonderry held a reception at Londonderry House last night on the eve of the opening of Parliament to meet the Prime Minister. The Marquess of Londonderry and Mr. Baldwin stood with Lady Londonderry at the head of the double staircase to receive the guests. Lady Londonderry wore black marocain, richly embroidered with jet and diamanté, and her jewels included a high crown of diamonds, diamond earrings, a diamond stomacher and necklace, and ropes of pearls.
