The Mill.

One of the keenest dancers at the brilliant Empire Ball at Lord Leverhulme's beautiful place at Hampstead was Lord Leverhulme himself. Despite his seventy-three years, he footed it gaily from ten till two-thirty in the morning. During the intervals of dancing he was showing friends some of the beautiful tapestries and pictures which adorn the walls of the ballroom. The ceiling of this room, which is the biggest private dance floor in London, is painted to represent a star-lit sky.

Pageant and Prizes.

The Pageant was a great success, as was the Spanish Cabaret of society girls, who entertained visitors during supper. Sir Cecil Harcourt Smith, director of the Victoria and Albert Museum, was one of the costume judges. The first prize (men's) was won by Mr. Fisher White as Wellington.
