THE ART GALLERY, PORT
SUNLIGHT.

The hours of opening and closing of the Lady Lever Art Gallery at Port Sunlight have been altered as follow:—November to April, week-days, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. May to October, week-days, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. This alteration takes effect on Monday next. The gallery is open to the public during these hours and admission is free.

The portrait of Lord Leverhulme, which was exhibited in the recent Autumn Exhibition at the Walker Art Gallery, by Philip A. de Laszlo, has been placed on exhibition in the Lady Lever Collection. A room, illustrating the period of the brothers Adam (1728-1792), has been completed and furnished with the very fine painted furniture of the 18th century.

A series of musical evening programmes has been arranged, commencing at 8.15, when the Port Sunlight Orchestra will play. The dates of these functions will be January 11th, February 8th, and March 8th, 1925. A short talk on art will be given by the curator, Mr. Sydney L. Davison, during each programme.
