LORD SHEFFIELD.

A memorial service for Lord Sheffield was held at St. Matthew's Church, Oakley-street, Camden Town, yesterday morning. The Rev. J. Carter Rendell, vicar of Old St. Pancras and chairman of the managers of the Stanley Central Schools, conducted the service, and Canon Swallow gave the address. The lesson was read by Mr. T. Archibald (first Stanley Scholar of the schools). The members of the family present included Lady Sheffield and the Hon. Adelaide and the Hon. Edward Stanley.
