Gates open at 2 p.m.; Matches will commence at 3 p.m.

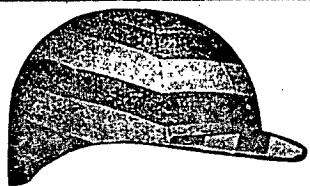

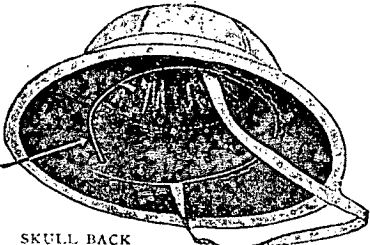

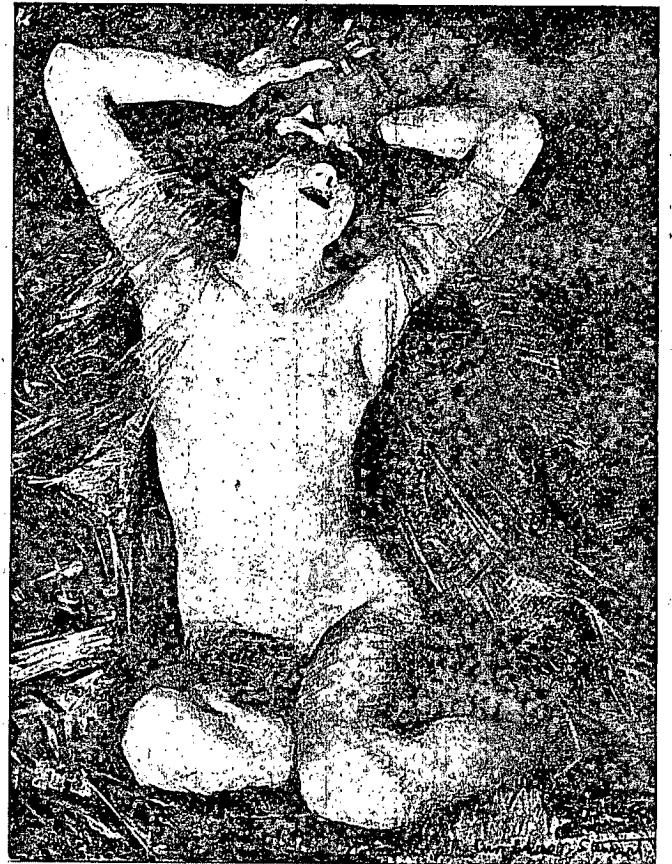
