PRESENTATION TO LORD AND LADY WILLINGDON.

Since returning to this country last May after 11 years in the Bombay and Madras Presidencies, Lord and Lady Willingdon have sat for portraits—the former to Mr. Oswald Birley and the latter to Mr. P. de Laszlo—which are to be presented to them "by all ranks of the Mesopotamian Expeditionary Force in appreciation of all they did for the benefit of that force during the war, 1914-1918."

Throughout the war Lord Willingdon was Governor of Bombay, which was the port for the departure and return of the Indian contingents and drafts,
