Pictures.

Plate.

Portraits, of artistic merit, of famous people connected with the sea.

Presentation swords and pistols.

The Committee would welcome information as to suitable examples, of fine quality, coming within the scope of the Exhibition, in the possession of members and their friends.

The Club is prepared to effect insurance on objects not already insured, but when insured the Committee would feel obliged to the owners if, when the time for removal to the Exhibition comes, they would give notice to the Insurance Companies concerned, so as to render it unnecessary to take out further insurances.

The Exhibition will be opened early in May, and will close at the end of July.

The Committee would be glad if objects offered for exhibition could be received at the Club early in April; they are prepared to make such arrangements for transport as lenders may desire.

The Committee are compelled, as on previous occasions, to reserve to themselves the absolute power of acceptance or rejection.

A Catalogue, with introductions similar to those of other Club Exhibitions, will be printed for presentation to Members and Contributors.
