As regards to the parquet floor. I have an assurance from The
Parquet and Breckers Ltd. in writing that they are ready
to accept any defects to the floor when I call upon them to do so.

As mentioned to you the other day, I advise you to let these go as far as
they will before having the defects remedied but if you wish I will let the
contractors to send advice. Will you let me know if you would
prefer this?

As regards Messrs J. P. White's account. The painting of the picture
rod has not included in the specification. Electric light (being only)
has allowed for to the picture only - which light is to be set up
out, you will remember - and subsequently you told me you wished for
long trunk. (See page 2 of specification) As regards the back piece I
carefully checked the figures for this as the structure is long on the high side
but after examining these I could not find a few pieces. It is made of cast-iron
the casting to be metal (not enamelled) stone surround, back, etc and
the back and sides. (The latter is the extensive one) better looking
to the old fireplace opening.
