Dear Mr. de Legge -

Upon interview yesterday I interpreted your instructions to me as follows - Will you please let me know if I am wrong in any detail? -

1. Accept estimate of £230.10.0 for new parquet floor to the two studios only. Request letter to call on you the sample of "Café-hou" when finish if possible.
2. Accept estimate of £413.10.0 less £37.17.0 for which lighting = £375.13.0 for oak paneling to smaller studio.
3. Put in hand the two proposals as 1" scale drawing showing yesterday the handle surround with tiled interior and hearth. I have tried and obtained an estimate for this before you go away. The present proposal to be stored pending instructions as to where it is to be refixed.
4. Accept estimate of £48.15.0 for Pergola.
5. The oak carpet from studios to be retained as far as practical on main landings of house - the present oak to be retained in back passage, ground floor.

I enclose my account for work done for you last year - not because I am in a hurry just, but because I feared that you had to know your expenses as far as possible.
