Dear Sir,

Before embodying in contract form the conditions we discussed for the holding of your exhibition next June, we think it will to submit them in this manner as a preliminary, so on hearing from you we may have them put in agreement form for our mutual acceptance.

1. That we agree to place our Gallery entirely at your disposal during the month of June next for an exhibition of your works.
2. That no other exhibition will be held on the premises during the period of your exhibition.
3. That we will work in the interests of the exhibition, and place the "machinery" of the firm at your disposal towards that end.
4. It is understood that in the main most of the principal works will not be for sale, and in consideration of this it is agreed -:
 - (a) That you pay us the sum of two hundred and fifty guineas, and also hold yourself responsible for such expenses as catalogues, cards, postages, and advertisements.
 - (b) That of those works that may be for sale you will allow us the usual commission of twenty-five per cent in the event of a sale being completed.
