Dear Sir.

Herewith we beg to set out the terms agreed between us for the holding of your exhibition from June 18th to July 16th, 1924.

- 1. That we agree to place our Gallery entirely at your disposal from June 18th to July 16th for an exhibition of your works.
- 2. That no other exhibition will be held on the premises during the period of your exhibition.
- 3. That we will work in the interests of the exhibition, and place the "machinery" of the firm at your disposal towards that end.
- 4. It is understood that in the main most of the principal works will not be for sale, and in consideration of this it is agreed:-
 - (a) That you pay us the sum of two hundred and fifty guineas, and also hold yourself responsible for such expenses as catalogues, cards, postages, and advertisements, but such expenses to be subject to your approval.

(b) That on those works that may be for sale you will allow us the usual commission of twenty-five per cent in the event of a sale being completed, and also ten percent on thehonoraria you receive for portraits during directly received through the exhibition.
