## ROYAL VICTORIAN ORDER.

THE Member of the Fourth or Fifth Class of the Order is to attend in Uniform or Levee Dress *with* all his Decorations and Medals, but if promoted from a lower class in the Order he is *not* to wear the Insignia of such lower class.

On being admitted into the Royal Presence he will advance opposite to The King and make the usual reverence by bowing, and then kneel on the right knee.

His Majesty will then invest him with the Insignia by affixing it to his left breast.

The Recipient will then raise his right arm horizontally, and The King will then place his hand on the wrist of the Recipient who will raise it to his lips.

He will then rise and retire from the Royal Presence with the like reverence that he made on entering.

N.B.—Those attending the Investiture will leave their Cocked Hats, Helmets, &c., in the Lower Hall. The left hand should be gloved.

Swords are *not* to be hooked up.
