May I take the liberty of approaching you with the request, that my honoraria for the portraits I had the honour to paint of the Royal Family, may be settled at convenience?

Firstly may I mention the portrait now in Kensington Palace of Her Majesty The Queen, which I was commanded to paint in the Summer of 1926. The honorarium for this picture is five hundred pounds.
