WORKS OF FAMOUS L'POOL SCULPTOR

MEMORIAL DISPLAY AT AUTUMN EXHIBITION

3802 A memorial display of the works of the late Charles Sargeant Jagger will be one of the special features of the Liverpool Autum Exhibition, which will open at the Walker Art Gallery on Thursday, October 10, and will continue until Saturday, January 4.

The exhibition will be kept open on Wadnesday. Thursday, and Saturday.

Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday evenings until 9 p.m., and on other evenings it will close at 6 p.m.

On the whole the Exhibition this year

will be distinctively a portrait occasion, since both sculptors and painters seem to have been concentrating their atten-

tion on portraiture.

Preparations are now being made for housing the Exhibition under the supervision of Alderman H. A. Cole, chairman of the Libraries and Arts Committee, and Alderman E. Haigh and Mr. G. H. Boothman, chairman and deputy-chairman of the Exhibition Sub-Committee.

There will be 1,400 exhibits, compared

with 1,690 last year.

EPSTEIN BUST.
The "Autumn" will include some of the more outstanding examples of portraiture, among them the much-discussed portrait of Lord David Cecil by Augustus John. which was exhibited at the Royal Academy this year, and was subsequently purchased by the Chantrey Bequest. Another Chantrey exhibit will be Epstein's bust of Einstein. There will be a bust of the King by Lady Hilton Young; a statue of the Prime of Wales by Laggery and a of the Prince of Wales by Jagger; and a portrait of the Duchess of Kent by Philip de Laszlo.

Oil paintings include Mussolini and President Roosevelt by Frank Salisbury; Lord Hailsham and Mr. L. Hore-Belisha by John A. A. Berrie; Lord Derby by E. I. Halliday, and a bust of Lord Reading by Jagger.

Among the portraits are those of Miss Madeleine Carroll, "Bunny" Austin, Mr. Hugh Walpole, Sir Giles G. Scott, and Mr. Somerset Maugham. There are also busts of Earl Haig and Earl Beatty by Jagger, and a portrait of Earl Jellicoe

by Eves.

One large room will be devoted to the memorial display of Jagger's works. It will represent fully both his war and peace sculptures, and his famous Prix de Rome "Bacchanalian Group," and such noteworthy reliefs as "Mocking Birds" and "Scandal," and the model figure of "Christ the King," intended for the Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral Cathedral.

A series of musical concerts will be held during the exhibition in the Prince George Gallery and another room. Art Union will again hold a legal lottery under the special Act of Parliament which allows it.
