We are very disappointed that we have not received from you a clear statement of the charges against Mr. de Laszlo.

May we remind you that we delivered Mr. de Laszlo's statement, in print, as far back as the 7th. November 1918. We wrote to you on the 26th. November 1918 asking for the substance of the case and the specific matters alleged against Mr. de Laszlo. On the 30th. Nov. 1918 we were informed that these would be delivered at once but six months have elapsed and we are still without this information.

Meanwhile Mr. de Laszlo continues under confinement and restraint without knowing, even after this lapse of time, with what he is charged.

We really must urge you to let us have these particulars. We pressed you to let us have them both in January and May

We have been through the bundle of documents which you have submitted for agreement and we notice that there must be many more which have not been disclosed. Do we understand that these are the whole of the documents which have been lodged with the Committee or are there any documents which you have filed with the Committee, or intend to file with the Committee, or to produce on the hearing which are not comprised in the documents submitted

It seems to us to be entirely useless to agree an incomplete bundle as it would be exceedingly unfair to Mr.
